Application Tips

RESUME

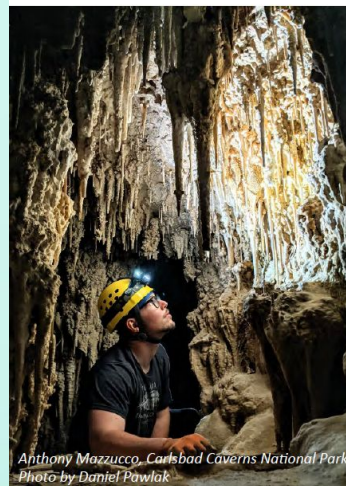
- Customize your resume
- Check your grammar and use spell check
- Add a professional summary
- Focus on accomplishments and skills
- Put your work history in chronological order
- Include current contact information
- Make sure interviewers can contact your references

COVER LETTER

- Customize your cover letter for each position
- Be creative and show your personality
- Keep it short, this is not a summary of your resume
- Use a business letter format and tone
- Use professional salutations (Mr., Ms., & Mrs.)
- Send your letter as a PDF attachment

INTERVIEW

- Research the agency/company beforehand
- Prepare questions for the interviewer
- Practice answering interview questions
- Dress appropriately (business casual/formal)
- Research location and arrive early
- Send a personal thank you email within 24 hours
